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A person is a voice or mask that an author, speaker or performer wears for a specific purpose. Multiple: person or characters. A persona comes from the Latin word meaning mask, and can also be called an implied author or artificial author. Author Katherine Ann Porter explained the connection between writing style and persona: Cultivated style will be similar to a mask. Everyone knows it's a mask, and sooner or later you have to show yourself - or at least you show yourself as a person who couldn't afford to show himself, and so created something to hide behind (Writers at Work, 1963). Similarly, essayist E.B. White noted that writing is a form of self-name. I'm not at all sure that I'm anything like the person I seem to be a reader of. I have lyrics and a real and invented autobiography, I essayist is a mask. (Joseph. Clancy, Literary genres in theory and practice. The man on paper is always a more remarkable character than its creator, who is an unhappy creature from a cold nose, minor compromises and sudden flights to the nobility... I suppose readers who feel friendly towards someone whose work they like rarely realize that they are drawn more to a set of aspirations than to a person. (E.B. White, Letters of E.B. Harper, 1976) The Man in a personal essay is a written construct, a fabricated thing, a kind of character - the sound of his voice a byproduct of carefully chosen words, his memories of experience, his run of thought and feelings, much more accurate than the mess of memories, thoughts and feelings. Indeed, when personal essayists write about self-creation in an essay, they often recognize an element of fabrication or a cunning impersonation. (Carl H. This meant that the actor was heard and his personality was recognized by others through sounds that are issued from the mouth of an open mask. The person makes himself known, felt accepted in others, through his specific roles and their functions. Famous pianists in history include Music for the Christmas anthem Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht was originally written for guitar in 1818 organist and composer Franz Xaver Gruber at the request of Joseph More, the new priest in Oberndorf, Austria. Mohr wanted to set to music three stanzas of lyrics illustrating the Christmas Eve atmosphere he had written two years before so that it could be performed for the first time on Midnight Mass. It was originally published in D major. In 1859, American John Freeman Young published an English translation of the first three carol stanzas. This quiet D arrangement is set in 3/4 time, and includes a vocal score with English and German lyrics.
